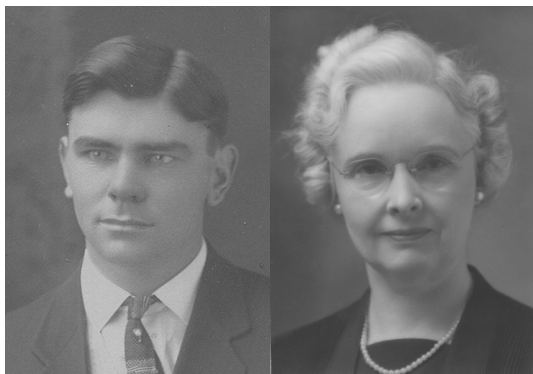


WILLIAM C. ELOE

William C. “Bill” Eloe was the high school coach and YMCA director in Aurora during the early 1900s. He coached the first AHS team to earn a state championship (Class F basketball) in 1920. William was also a founding member of the Aurora Rotary Club.

Delight M. Eloe started teaching grades 3 and 4 at South Elementary School in Aurora in 1928 and retired as principal of West Elementary School in 1958. During that time she cared for an invalid husband, raised five children, and maintained her community and church leadership activities.
